

## Ballinger-Pinchot Controversy

- C. Ballinger-Pinchot Controversy
  - 1. Taft appoints Ballinger (Sec of Interior)
    - a. allows forested area development
  - 2. Gifford Pinchot
    - a. accuses Ballinger in Alaskasyndicate business group
    - b. leaks story to public press
    - c. Taft fires for insubordination
