- C. German Offensive
  - 1. Argonne Forest
    - a.Sept. 26, 1918
      - -600,000 troops
      - -4,000 cannons
- D. War Ends
  - 1. Nov. 9 = Overthrow
    - 11 day, 11<sup>th</sup> month, 11<sup>th</sup> hour



- B. Treaty of Versailles
  - 1. End Germany Military
  - 2. Reparations \$33 billion
  - 3. War Guilt Clause
- C. New Nations:
  - -Soviet Union
  - -Turkey
  - -Austria slit with Hungary
  - -Yugoslavia, Poland, Czechoslovakia
