

# Carpetbaggers & Scalawags




- A. Carpetbaggers & Scalawags
  - Carpetbaggers Northerners elected to gov. in the South
    \*exploited the South
  - 2. <u>Scalawags</u> Southerners who worked with Republicans and supported Reconstruction
    - \*small farmers
    - \*businessmen

- B. African Americans in Politics
  - 1. Reconstruction Government
    - \* local offices:
      - police chiefs
      - -school trustees
      - -commissioners
    - \* 14 = House of Reps.
    - \* 2 = U.S. Senators ex.) Hiram Revels




## Republican Reforms in South

#### Southern Resistance




II. Southern Resistance toward: blacks & Rep's

- a. South receives:
  - Postmaster General
  - -Federal \$
  - -withdrawal of troops

    - 2. Sharecroppers
